#### HOLIDAY TIME:

Over the Easter holiday period, there are some VERY IMPORTANT things to do if you wish to play:

- Reserve a court in advance use the Book A Court system via our website (<u>www.royalparktennis.com.au</u>) as staff time on site will be quite limited. That will give you a pin # for the gate (near court 10)
- You need to register before using the system otherwise you will be charged; if you wish to register,
   please see details attached, or contact Carole (0419 560 436) to activate the registration process ASAP
- Don't forget to lock the car-park barrier if you are last to leave the courts;
- Courts MUST be well watered before play starts, and at least every half-hour thereafter.

### COURT CARE & BOOKINGS

With Night Comp in full swing, and Pennant about to start, tennis is very popular, and court availability is quite limited, especially from 5.00pm weekdays, and generally on the weekend. Don't just arrive & hope!!

You MUST book a court if you wish to play, & check at the office before going on court. Use the web based system for bookings between 7-00am-4.30pm Monday-Friday

You MUST also pay a Visitor's Fee before playing if you invite a friend to have a hit.

Watering from fence to fence before you play is very important – and you should water again at least every 30 minutes. We also request that the court surface is sprinkled before bagging the court – that helps stop the en tous cas from blowing away.

#### General Open sessions: SUNDAY afternoons: 2.00 - 4.00pm





### **FACILITIES UPDATE** — please note these!

There are some relatively major items recently added to our "to be done" list:





- Cypress trees alongside courts 14 & 11 are being removed by VIcTrack, and initial work
  near Court 14 has obviously changed the light and spatial perspective down there.
   Further work is to be done, with possible trimming of trees alongside our playground
  area also on the agenda with MCC.
- The LED lighting project was finished some time ago, but we have two features needing further work: corners on Courts 4 & 7 are not as well lit as is desirable, and Court 13 has an alignment issue in the northern corner. Both are with MCC for attention.
- New shade sails have been installed in the walkway between courts 1-3 & 4-7. The previous ones ripped in the high winds and MCC contractors have completed the work.

All these items are being discussed and worked through with MCC and will be gradually resolved.

## National Claycourt Championships

This high profile event was hosted at our club earlier this month, with Tennis Victoria conducting a 5 day tournament involving local, interstate and international players. Both singles and doubles were contested, in Qualifying (singles) and Main draws. Several club members participated, including Jihee Lee and Enzo Aguiard – both did well and posted several wins. Overall winners were Belinda Woolcock defeated Alison Bai 6-2 6-3. In the Men's final Harry Bourchier defeated Andrew Whittington 6-3 6-1.



Overall, the tournament ran very well, and our complex won many favourable comments from players, parents and visitors. Club Manager Carole co-ordinated a band of volunteers on canteen, tidying up and general support activity, and their assistance was greatly appreciated. The club has benefited both financially and reputation-wise from the opportunity to show case our facilities.
