
So – please wait until Carole gives you the OK and releases the courts back into general use. Close attention to watering and bagging will be mandatory to qualify to get back on!!

COVID-19 again influenced this annual tournament, held over 2 days of Labour Day weekend. Player entries trickled in, but a sudden rush in the closing stage meant 77 local juniors participated. Round-robin format was used in most events to give players in an opportunity to mix and test their skills. Star attraction again was the 10 & Under Boys "green ball" contest, and the winner medallions were very popular.





All participants played in great spirit and with good sportsmanship, with no incidents.

Another positive feature was the greater participation by girls, with 25 registrants (+12 v 2021).

They had 4 events, and it's encouraging to see this trend reversal. The boys contested 6 events.

COURT CARE & BOOKINGS

With Night Comp in full swing, and Pennant underway, tennis is very popular, and court availability is quite limited, especially from 5.00pm weekdays, and generally on the weekend.

You MUST book a court if you wish to play, & play on the court that you booked!

You MUST also pay a Visitor's Fee before playing if you invite a friend to have a hit.

Watering from fence to fence before you play is very important (if no rain!) – and you should water again at least every 30 minutes. We also request that the court surface is sprinkled before bagging the court – that helps stop the en tous cas from blowing away.

CLUB CHAMPIONSHIPS 2022

Participation decreased quite markedly this year, with 66 entries from 46 players contesting just 7 of a possible 20 or more events. Many of these are reflected in Policies that the club has developed, and recently the Management Committee has revised two of our current policies.

Environmental Sustainability:

We aim to promote good sustainability practices, to reduce the environmental impacts of our activities and to encourage our members and visitors to do the same. The relevant policy has been updated to address "single use plastic", consistent with widespread growing concern with such commodities.



The following has been added to our Purchases and Resource Consumption statement:


- Promote the use of drink taps and fountain and discourage the use of single use plastic drink bottles.
- Do not purchase or use disposable plastic plates, plastic cups and plastic cutlery.

You can help in the following ways:

- Please don't bring single use plastic drink containers to tennis adopt a reusable drink bottle; there are taps off court, bubblers on court, and a new water fountain now installed on the decking behind court 8.
- Avoid bringing/leaving disposable plastic containers, plates, cups and cutlery to the club. Try
 using bamboo cutlery & paper plates; club crockery/cutlery is also available.
